How should I prepare the Workshop Room?

- One dedicated room for the full day, 8:30-2:30 with a 30 minute lunch
- Adjustable seating for writing and moving
 - Some teachers arrange in a circle or semi-circle, creating a performance area for readings and improvisations.
 - Individual writing space is also important.
- White board, chalkboard, or easel with pens
- Have students wear name tags
- Consider participating as a student yourself, or please support the playwright in creating a positive learning environment by staying in the room as an engaged observer.
